Dagana Dzongkhag Launches its Local Products



Honey, Pickel, Tengma, Mustard Oil and Bamboo baskets

On 24 August 2018, Dagana Dzongkhag launched six local farm products in Tsendagang Gewog. The products included Bottled Mustard Oil, Vacuum Packed Pulses (Kidney Beans and Green grams), Flattened Corn snacks (Tengma of different flavors), Pickle, Honey and Bamboo basket.

The launch was aimed at encouraging local farmers to venture into food processing business, which is yet to be explored fully. Further, it is hoped that value-added locally processed farm products will be popularized among the local consumers. In doing so, the production and consumption of local products by the locals would be promoted and help to achieve self-sufficiency.

The day long program was graced by Venerable Lam Neten, Daga Rabdey, Dasha Dzongdag, Dasha Drangpon, Dasha Dzongrab, Dasha Dungpa, Regional and Sector Heads, Gewog officials and Farmers.

After the launch, the sale began and the products sold out in no time. The farmers/sellers were, therefore, highly encouraged and committed to put in their best efforts.

The Tashiding Farmers Group comprising seven members are doing the plantation of winter green chillies with material support of 25 numbers of plastic sheets or Green house plastic sheets from the Department of Agriculture, MoAF and other materials like cement, sand and metal rods being provided by the Dzongkhag Agriculture Office. The Agricultural staff also provide technical backstopping.

The labor including working charges are borne by the Group.

The work began from the September, 2018 and the Group managed to sell more than 50kgs of chillies. They had plan to extend the green house in the future.

They can also have the option to produce other crops from next year or rotational cropping. Recently, they had completed with two water harvest tanks using 300 GSM silpaulin sheets.

“We are happy for the help and we are also putting our effort”, says Chairman of the Group, Mr. Lain Bdr. Rai.

The similar programme was also held at Tsendagang, Drujeygang, Tsangkha and three Gewogs under Lhamoizingkha Dungkhag.

Training on Agricultural Land Development (ALD)

The Training for Agriculture Extension Supervisors on Agriculture Land Development was conducted from 10-12th December 2018 at Tashiding Gewog.

The objective of the training was to build knowledge and skills of Agriculture Land Development techniques and to provide first-hand experience through practical session.

In doing so, it was expected that Dzongkhag Agriculture staff will be better prepared to initiate land development works, which is one of the priority programs of the Dzongkhag Agriculture Sector and the Department of Agriculture in the 12FYP.

Dagana Dzongkhag has projected a target of 700 acres for Agriculture Land Development in the 12th FYP.

Agriculture Land Development is defined as sustainable development and management of arable land through change in land form, for enhanced agriculture production and continuous agroecosystem services (ALD Guidelines 2017). ALD will not only minimize land degradation but also facilitate farm mechanization to some extent.

The training program was carried out with the financial support from the Dzongkhag Agriculture Sector and with the technical supports of National Soil Service Centre, Department of Agriculture. The Dzongkhag Excavator was used for the field work.

The first day of the three-day training was dedicated to in-house theory session and the participants were briefed on Agriculture Land Development activities.

On the second and third days, field work was conducted at Shamdolay village.

As part of the practical session, ALD techniques such as Bench Terracing and Construction of Check dams were demonstrated to the participants.

Bio-Bin

Bio-Bin also called as Organic Bin is a composting bin for outdoor use. It is made up of locally available materials. It is rectangular box with transparent roof and bottomless. It is simple and easy to handle. As a part of Dagona Dzongkhag Waste Management program, the Dzongkhag Administration issued 25 Bio-Bins for the Residents of Daga Town, NHDCL Colony, few Schools and 14 Gewogs to convert any bio degradable waste including kitchen waste to compost for gardening. The segregation of waste is monitored during the time of garbage collection. So far no odor issues related to Bio-Bins have been reported.

With the provision of Bio-Bins, the interest of the Residents in kitchen gardening has been enhanced.

Sterilization Program in Gewogs

Sterilization program, also known as CABC (Community Animal Birth Control) program, was carried out in three Gewogs (Goshi, Gesarling and Drujeygang) from 22nd – 26th October 2018 with main focus on Schools (Gesarling and Drujeygang Central Schools). The program mainly targeted to sterilize the dogs and cats and vaccinate against rabies, thereby to control the population of free roaming dogs. Rabies is one of the most dangerous and feared zoonotic diseases. The main vector of rabies is the dog (95% of human cases are caused by the bite of a rabid dog). Every year approximately 50,000 people die worldwide due to rabies and half of these deaths occur in Asia.

Castration of scrub animals (goats and pigs) was also carried out as and when owners presented. As a focal point of CABC in the Dzongkhag, the program was planned wherein nested 3rd Batch BSc. Animal Science trainees from CNR joined the program for their week long surgery block week as a part of their academic requirement. They were trained on the CABC and CNVR (catch neuter vaccinate and release) protocol.

The sterilization program was aimed to control dog population in the Dzongkhag, control/prevent rabies outbreak by controlling dog population and rabies vaccination in the Dzongkhag and practical exposure to the CNR trainees on CNVR protocol rabies. Moreover one to one awareness on Rabies and the importance of timely vaccination to stop the transmission of Rabies virus was communicated to those owners and people who brought their animals for sterilization.

A total of 125 animals (dogs=105, cats=15, pig=2 and goat=2) were sterilized during the program. Given the importance of rabies, all those cats and dogs were also vaccinated against rabies. The majority of the owners brought dogs (84%) for sterilization, followed by cats (12%) and goats and pigs (3.2%). The ratio of males sterilized was higher than females although we target the female population.

The Dzongkhag Administration would like to express our sincere gratitude to CNR Animal Science faculties and trainees for showing their keen interest to learn and help our Dzongkhag in controlling the dog and cat populations for the past few years. We would also like to thank the Gewog Administrations of Goshi, Gesarling and Drujeygang for recognizing the significance of mass sterilization of dogs and cats and for their continued support. Finally, we would like to acknowledge and thank people of all the three Gewogs who came with their dogs/cats at the designated sterilization points.

Launching of Peling Community Based Capture Fishery Management Group

On 28th November 2018, the Peling Community Based Capture Fishery Management Group was launched at a simple ceremony. Dasho Dzongdag was the Chief Guest and Tseza Gup, Dzongkhag Livestock Officials, Dzongkhag Agriculture Officer, Officials from Regional Livestock Development Centre (RLDC), Wangdue and National Research Centre for Reverine (NRCR) & Lake Fisheries (LF), Haa, Forestry Officials, Dagana and Gewog Administrative Officer, Tseza attended the launch.

The Chief Guest highlighted on the importance of establishing a capture fishery group and handing it over to the Community. The Peling Community based Capture Fishery Management Group comprise of 23 members. The 10 kilometer stretch from Gabachu (tributary of Daga Chu) in the north to Jaktey Chu in the south was handed over to the Community for a period of five years.

The Community as a whole is expected to benefit through the sale of fish generating additional income. The Capture Fishery will also serve to secure a nutritional status of the Community by providing them with the much needed animal protein which is both organic and fresh. Being the only legal entity of managing the fish resources, the Community will be encouraged to protect the fish resources at all times ensuring a sustainable mode of fish harvesting practice. It will further help to eliminate destructive fishing practices, thereby protecting the entire aquatic ecology and biodiversity. Besides fish production, there is a great potential for developing recreational fisheries as Peling-Kamichu Highway is under construction and the development of recreational fishery can bring immense benefit to the tourism sector and indirectly benefit the Community through development of eco-tourism (home stay, hotels, shops, river guides).

The preliminary field works on sensitization and wild fishery scoping program started in May 2017 with technical and financial support from RLDC, Wangdue and NRCR & LF, Haa. Subsequently, the training cum workshop was conducted for the community fishery participants to draft the group Bye-laws and management plans. Peling is one of the three villages under Tongsho-Peling chiwogs in Tseza Gewog under Dagana Dzongkhag.

According to the historical texts, the significance of conducting five days of Daga Tschechu is associated with the five local deities of Dagana namely *Aum Jomo Dakarmo*, *Phola Taktshang Gangbur*, *Shathongtsen*, *Gophu Kencho* and *Molha Darayu Tsho*. Annually, Daga Tschechu starts from the eleventh day of the eleventh month and concludes on fifteenth day of the eleventh month.

This year, the Tschechu was commenced from 18-22 December 2018. Different to other Dzongkhags' Tschechu, some of the mask dances performed during Daga Tschechu are unique. One of them is *Shawo Shachi* (Dance of Stag and Hounds) which is performed like a two part play held over two days. The first part is performed on the hill over Tschechu pang.

Gyen-dru Pawo Cham (Dance of Heroes with Six Kinds of Ornaments) is also said to be performed only during Paro and Daga Tschechus. *Tsarcham*, the dance introducing the roles of different animals in the intermediate state (*Bardo*) is also said to be performed only during Daga Tschechu.

On the final day of Daga Tschechu which coincides with the auspicious fifteenth day of the eleventh month, Tenpai Thongdrol was unfurled and thousands of people came to receive its blessing.
